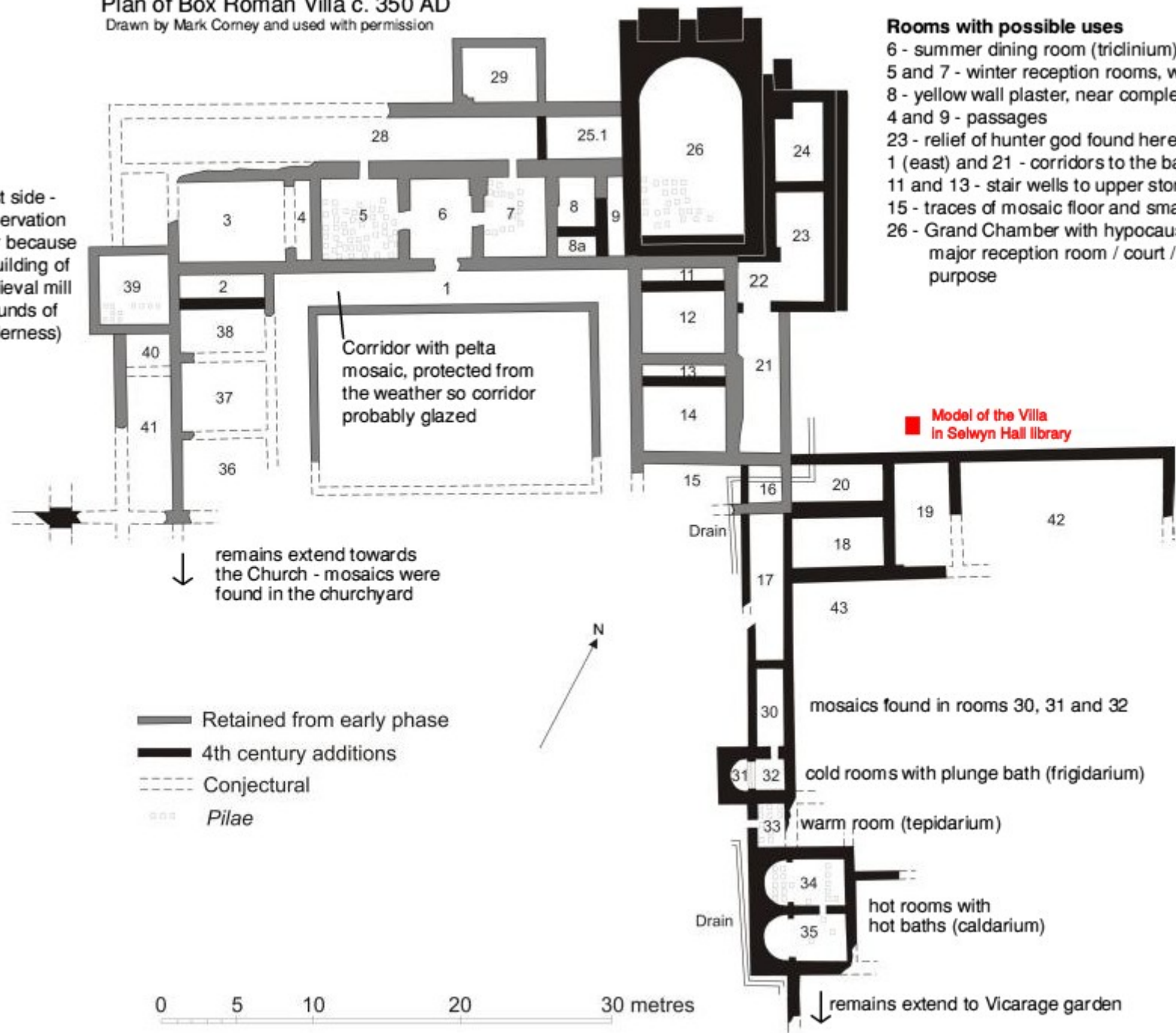


# Plan of Box Roman Villa c. 350 AD

Corridor with pelta  
mosaic, protected  
from the weather so  
corridor  
probably glazed

remains extend towards  
the Church - mosaics were  
found in the churchyard

- Retained from early phase
- 4th century additions
- - - Conjectural
- ... Pilae

## Rooms with possible uses

- 6 - summer dining room (triclinium)
- 5 and 7 - winter reception rooms, with hypocaust
- 8 - yellow wall plaster, near complete mosaic
- 4 and 9 - passages
- 23 - relief of hunter god found here
- 1 (east) and 21 - corridors to the baths complex
- 11 and 13 - stair wells to upper storey
- 15 - traces of mosaic floor and small stone altar
- 26 - Grand Chamber with hypocaust - major reception room / court / ceremonial purpose

mosaics found in rooms 30, 31 and 32

cold rooms with plunge bath (frigidarium)

warm room (tepidarium)

hot rooms with  
hot baths (caldarium)

remains extend to Vicarage garden
